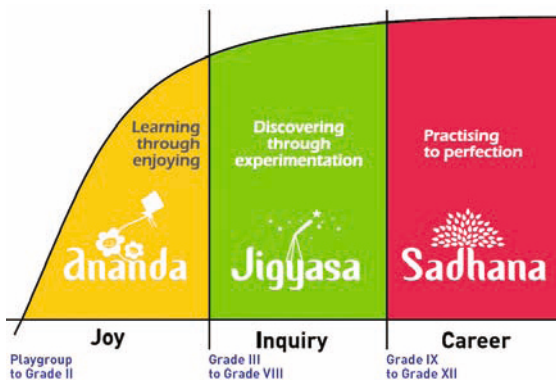
## Learning Stages at Sanskriti

### Ananda

At Sanskriti, the Pre-Primary classes and Classes 1 and 2 are called the Ananda phase.

In Pre-Primary, we follow a thematic approach. Through themes such as seasons, animals, gardens and festivals, children learn various subjects like plant science, animal science, mathematics and languages. Field visits, audio visual aids and theme based activities give children real experiences and make learning interesting. Sports, music, dance, art and craft are also given a lot of importance to help the child's physical, social, emotional development and creativity.

In classes 1 and 2, along with themes, subject based learning also is given a lot of importance.



## >> Early Age English Language Learning

Sanskriti uses widely acclaimed international practices such as Jolly Phonics™ from Jolly Learning Company, UK for teaching the English language to young children. Our goal is to help children to be independent readers by the age of five.



## >> Foundations of Mathematics

Sanskriti aims to impart Mathematics education to children by removing any fear of the subject. We do this by using mathematical toolkits called Jodogyan, puzzles and games to introduce concepts and make Maths interesting and relevant to children's lives.

## >> Music, Arts, Craft, Drama and Sports [MACDS]

In the Ananda stage, 60% of the time is allocated to activities which develop emotional, physical and creative intelligences. Music, Art and Sports are not considered extra curricular at Sanskriti and they are an integral part of each day. We believe that exposure to art and aesthetics is central to the development of a child's body and soul.

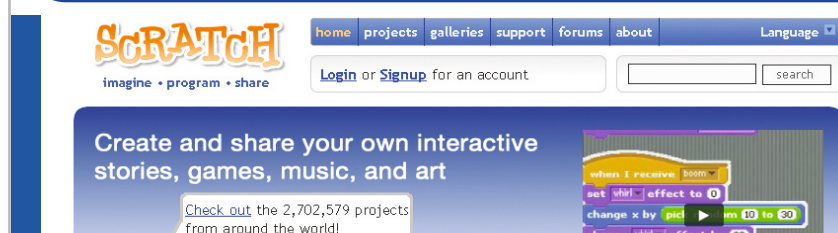
## >> Project Based Learning Nurtures Curiosity

At Sanskriti classes 3 to 8 fall under called the Jigyasa phase. In these classes children get a lot of exposure to learning through projects such as creating stories and story books, designing musical instruments, making a drama script, designing a vehicle or creating a web page. Projects are used to help children do research and learn by asking questions.

## >> Early Age IT Curriculum

From Class 3 onwards our children use Scratch TM, a programming language developed by MIT Media Lab. As children create their own stories and animations and share their creations on the web, they learn to think creatively and work collaboratively.

## >> Discipline : Goal Setting and Quality Circle Time (QCT)

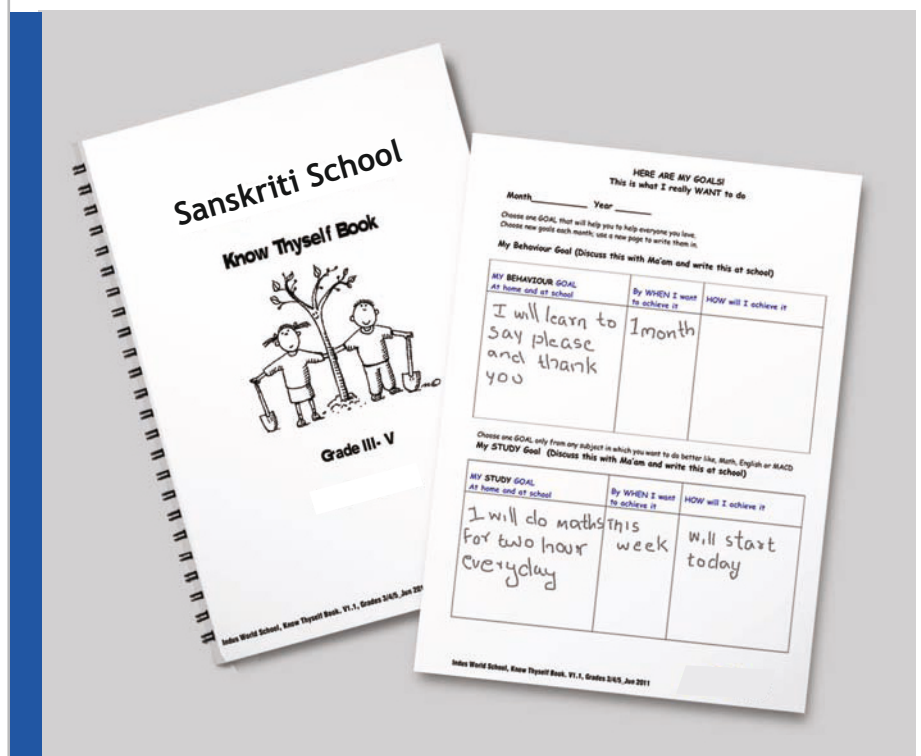
Sanskriti have a very strong track record of outstanding student discipline and behaviour. Our unique approach of treating students with dignity and respect is at the foundation of this environment.

# Evaluation and Examination System

Sanskriti Schools are based on the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) curriculum.

At the beginning of each academic session there is typically a Baseline Assessment in each major subject to help the teacher understand the learning levels of the class. Through the year we follow the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) system for all classes, as prescribed by CBSE. Our assessment systems are designed to test understanding and not simply the ability to reproduce facts.

We have a two term academic year where the report card is handed out at the end of each term on the day of Parent Mentor Interaction (PMI) .

## >> CCE Assessments

Pre-primary to Class 5

The assessment is based on activities, written worksheets and oral assessments. Assessment happens 4 times in a year in pre-primary classes and 6 times in a year in classes 1 and 2. The subject performance is described by breaking up the subject into multiple skills and each skill is graded on a 3 point scale. Our mentors write a comprehensive and continuous detailed profile on each child, keeping track of their growth and progress.

Class 6 Onwards

The assessments are based on a set of Formative and Summative assessments. Formative assessments are typically topic based monthly assessment which can be in the form of written quizzes, orals, discussions, projects etc. Summative assessments are written tests held at the end of the two-terms. The report cards include the results of the formative and summative tests. A 10 point grading scheme is followed in the report card.



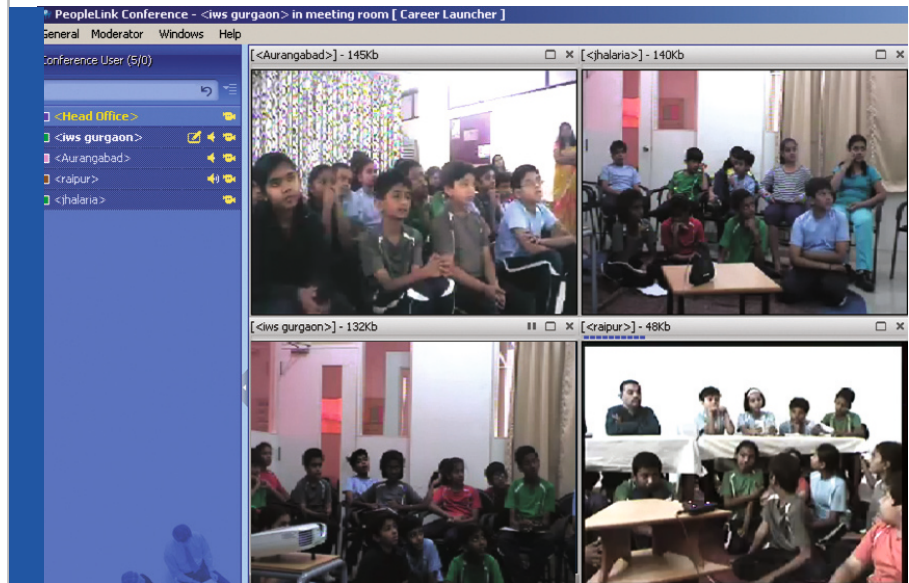

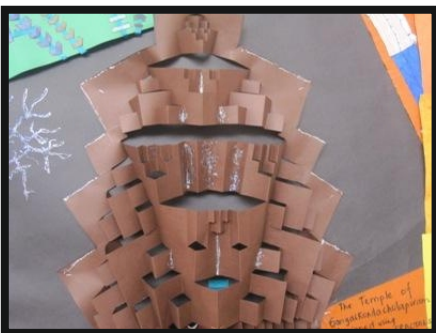


# Rules and regulations

## HOSTEL RULES :



1. It is essential to follow the stipulated routine for almost all the boarders.
2. Under no circumstances parents/Guradians will be permitted to meet their wards without the permission of the concerned authority (Principal/Hostel Incharge, Days's offers necessary.
3. Boys/Girls are not permitted to keep any cash or electronics items or golden ornaments with them.
4. Students are not allowed to keep any type of edible material with them.
5. The Guardians are permitted to contact their wards on phone only on Sunday.
6. No student will be allowed to leave the campus without the written permission of the Principal. A student can be withdrawn/removed from the hostel either on parent's/Guardian's request or in case of indiscipline like not following the routine, destroying the essential goods of the hostel. In all the cases mentioned above, the entire amount of the school fee/assets/Hostel charges paid for the whole session will be forfeited. No request for return of such fee/charges will be entertained on any account.
7. Medical Care :
  - (a) Sick boys/Girls will report about their illness to the Hostel Incharge/Day's officer. He/Shewill make an arrangement of medicine, the cost of which will be paid from the pupil's personal account deposit.
  - (b) For minor ailments parents are not informed. If situation demands, parents/guardians will be informed.





## 8. Leave Regulation :

- (a) During school terms pupils are not permitted to go home.
- (b) In special cases like illness of the students, parents, death of the dear ones, marriage of the nearest ones etc, leave may be granted.
- (c) For all types of leave request should be made to the principal.
- (d) Parents should note the date and time when the boy/girl has to return after the leave. If a student has to be detained due to illness, the matter should be conveyed on phone and an application for leave should be accompanied with medical fitness certificate when the student reports back.

## 9. Long Vacations :

- (a) Summer Vacation
- (b) Holi Vacation
- (c) Puja Vacation : (Durga Puja, Chhath, Deepawali)

The guardians and parents are requested to take away their wards personally on the eve of vacation. In case they are unable to come personally they must send their representatives. Who are enrolled in hostels register. The date of Vacation will be notified in item.

Boys must be present on the opening day of the school after vacation. Leave an application for absence will be considered only when the reason for absence is found genuine.

#### General Rules and Information :

1. In accordance with the rules of the school, the Parents Guardians will accept and authorize participation of their wards in compulsory programs of tours, expeditions, camps etc. During their stay at the hostel.
2. Parents/guardians will not hold the school for compensation against any claims arising due to illness, accident or any other cause.
3. All parents have to sign an agreement with the school at the when their son/ward joins school.
4. Students are responsible for their belongings while every effort is made by the school authorities to reduce the loss of such articles, the ultimate responsibility rests with the students themselves.
5. No student shall be eligible to get promotion unless he has completed 80% of attendance.
6. Registration for admission : The printed application form for admission along with the prospectus can be obtained from third week of December on cash payment of Rs. 100/- from the office/sale for Rs.-----
